### LEVERAGING THE 5 PRACTICE AREAS FOR COMMUNITY CHANGE

#### Community Engagement

- "Co-creating the future you want to see"
- Integrated as the work (not a top on)
- The way the work gets done
- Helps facilitate clashing voices

#### Evaluating Impact

- "Reality testing": is that really the way the world works? Are we really generating effects?
- Always catching up to innovators
- Participatory, real time, time to make sense of data
- Complex issues are rooted in systems
- We need mixed methods
