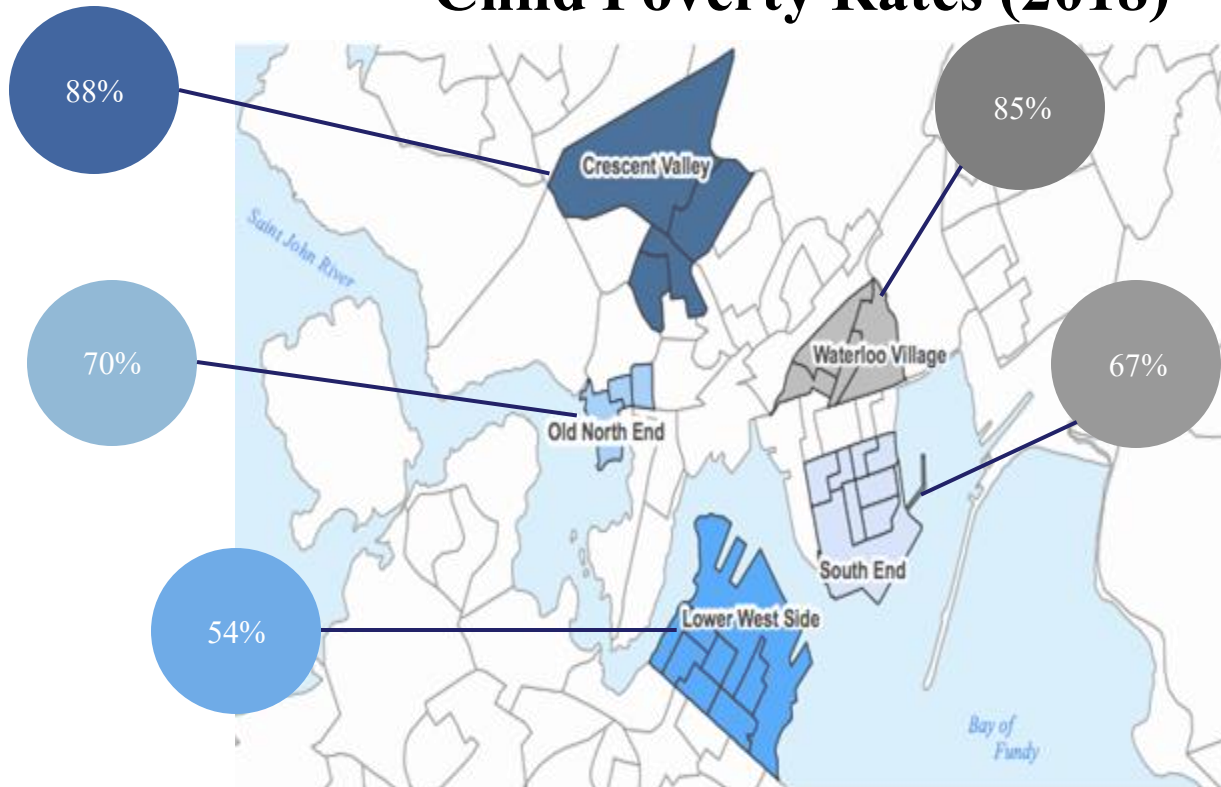

Child Poverty Rates (2018)



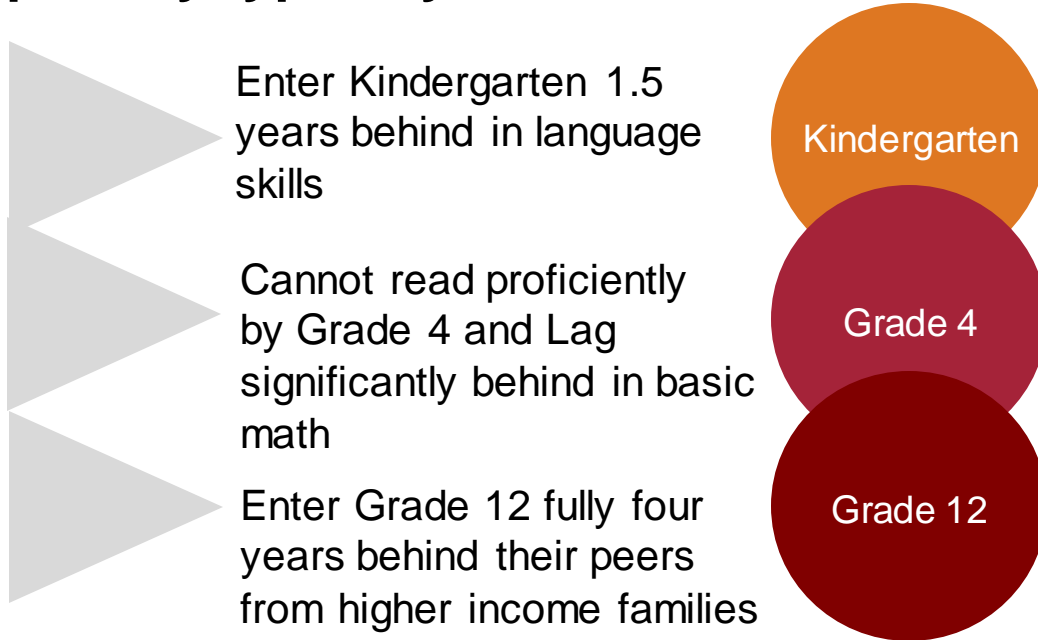

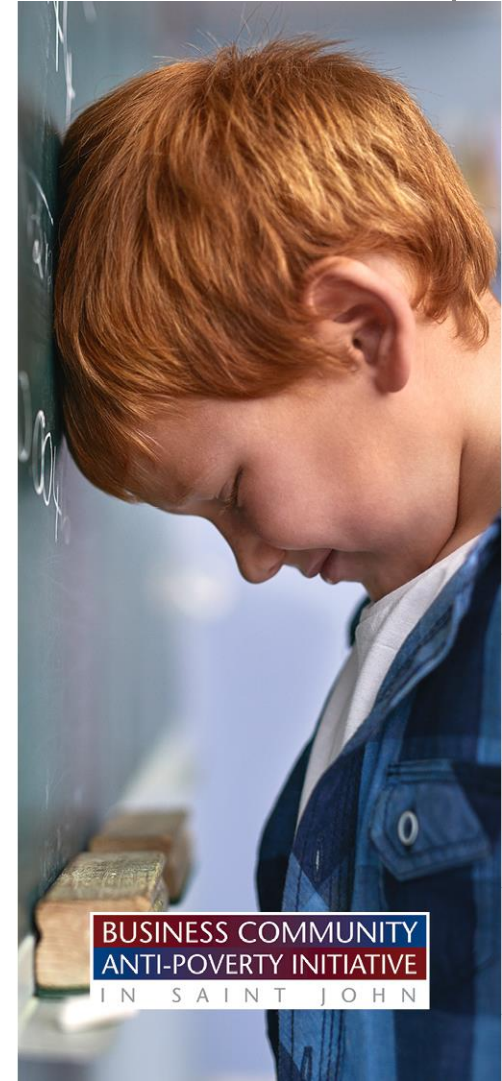

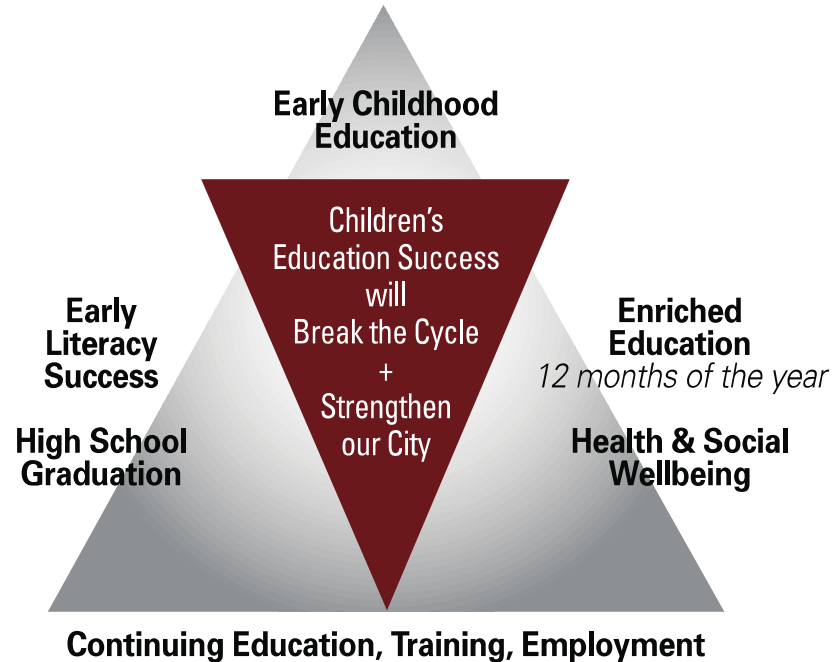

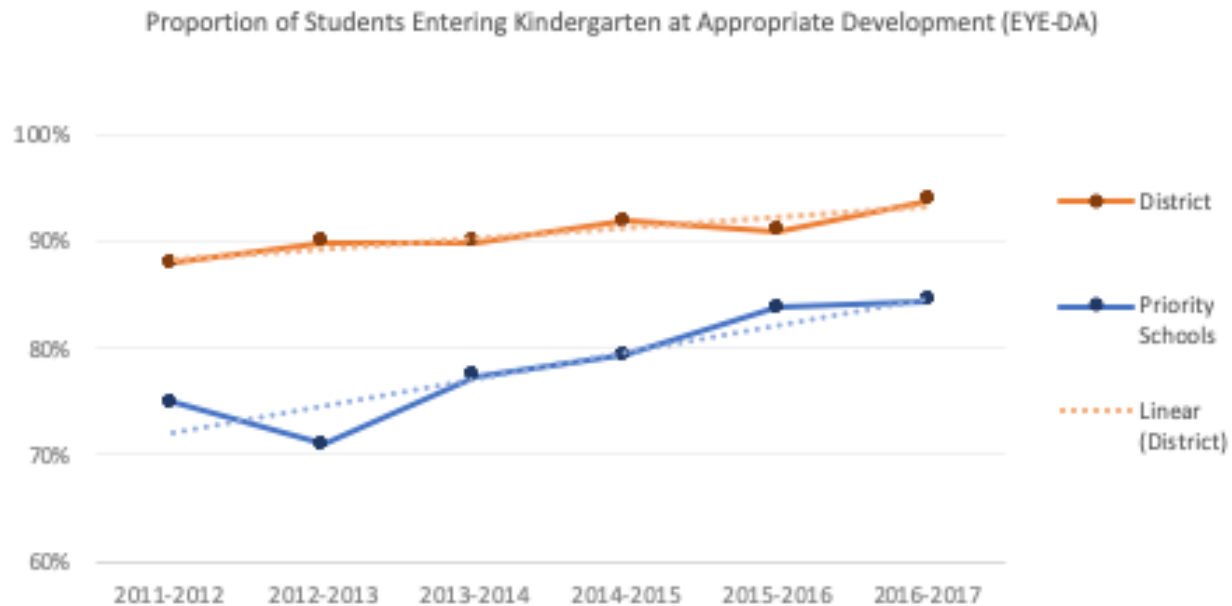

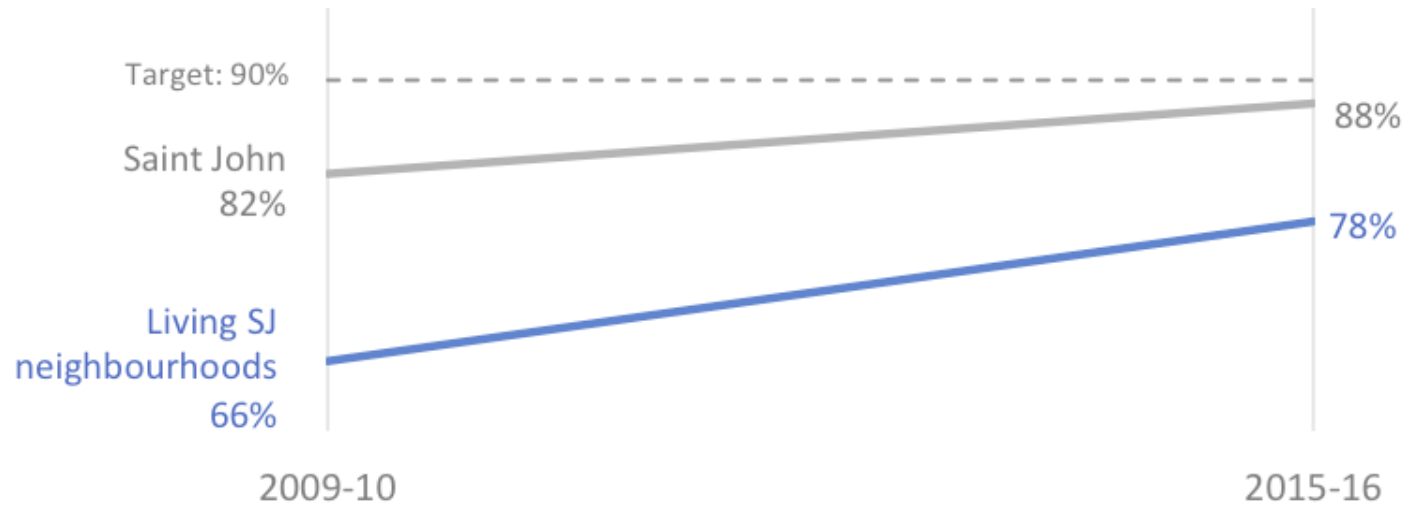

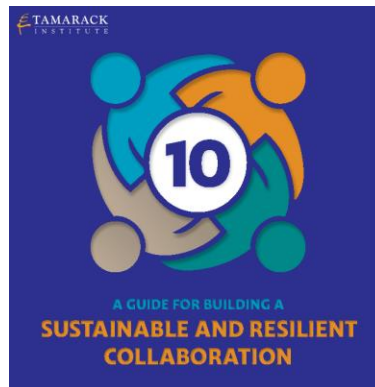


Upcoming Learning Opportunities
